Representational Abstract Non-Representational Images

ASSIGNMENT 8 Representational-Abstract-Non-Representational Images

GOAL

The goal of this assignment is to create a representational, abstract and non-representational image from a photo using Illustrator. The image will be in grey scale and drawn from a selected photograph. Your photograph should be a head shot; random person, celebrity, musician, someone you know personally, or yourself.

***Select a photo in the PORTRAIT orientation or if it is landscape format you will need to determine how you will edit it to fit portrait orientation.

PROCESS

- 1. Open Illustrator
- Go to File>New>Name: CTA8_LastNameFirstName Number of Artboards: 3 Spacing 20 pt (default) Columns: 1 Size: Letter Orientation will be portrait. Width & Height: Default Bleed: leave as is Color: RGB Raster Effects: High 300 ppi. Click "OK"
- 3. Place the image on the first art board.
- 4. Center it (visually).
- 5. Lock the layer, Select/Add new layer

6. Create a Greyscale value scale. you can use the palette in Illustrator but your palette is limited to 5 values.

7. Using the pencil tool, pen tool, and shapes, trace the image. DO NOT USE AUTO TRACE. Reduce the amount of detail in order to create a representational image that is not a photo representation. See examples.

8. Copy your first Representational image onto the second art board, reduce the amount of detail again and abstract the shapes. This is your abstract image. DO NOT USE AUTO TRACE OR ANY FILTERS

9. Copy your Abstraction onto the third art board. Revise to create a non-representational design. This image should not be representational at all, but completely abstract using grey scale, pattern and shape. DO NOT USE AUTO TRACE OR ANY FILTERS

10. Save as .pdf and share with me via OneDrive.
