PROJECT DETAILS

- Create a 3-D composition that expresses rhythm and repetition using found or recycled materials.
- Your project must illustrate a statistic that you research and explain during critique. You can use statistics or information from the in-class lecture to guide the creation of your project, but your project must have a conceptual framework and must be supported by facts.
- Statistics should not be older than 2022
- The use of rhythm and repetition in your composition needs to support your concept. This is key!
- In addition to your project, you are required to submit a written artist's statement (I will provide you with a sample artist's statement). The statement must be typed and a minimum of 500 words.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND ASSESSMENT (CONTINUED ON NEXT PAGE)

- There is no size restriction.
- You should expect to spend at least 8-10 hours on this project.
- A proposal is due on **Wednesday, September 25th**. You must present your proposal to the class for feedback and be prepared to discuss it during class. See proposal guidelines on page 3 of this assignment.



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SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS AND ASSESSMENT

For the midterm critique you will need to address the following:

How did you incorporate your statistic into the piece?

What are the numbers, how are they represented?

What is the link between the statistics you chose to represent and the form/materials you used?

How did you incorporate rhythm and repetition?

What kind of rhythm is it?

Alternating, progressive, polyrhythmic, do you hope to generate a kinesthetic experience for the viewer?
